



**2008 I-LYA Junior Regatta at Put-in-Bay
RULES OF CONDUCT ACKNOWLEDGEMENT FORM**

10:00 PM Curfew: Each member and his/her chaperone(s) are responsible for seeing that competitors enter and remain in their sleeping rooms at 10:00 pm with lights out by 11:00 pm. Same sex visitation between rooms is allowed until 10:00 pm. Coed visitation in hotel rooms is NOT permitted at any time. When chaperones are certain that all of their competitors are accounted for, he/she shall enter the date, time, Club name, and chaperone signature on the Sign-in sheet at the hotel desk. In the event of bad weather, cancelled races, and at all other times that the competitors are not restricted to the grounds of the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club, supervision of competitors is the sole responsibility of the Club chaperones. The hotel requires that all competitors are supervised at all times while they are present.

Competitors may not drive automobiles on the island during the I-LYA 2008 Junior Bay Week Regatta. Automobiles may not be driven on the island by competitors after they have registered or before 7:00 am on Friday, July 18. The hotel is within walking distance of all events so competitors may not be transported by anyone during the regatta. The NO WHEELS rule is in effect for the entire duration of the regatta. The only exception will be travel to the Thursday banquet. There will be no other exceptions – no skateboards, no bicycles, no scooters, no rollerblades, etc.

Parking is limited at the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club. NO cars, boats, or trailers are permitted on the PIBYC grounds prior to 10:00 am on July 13, 2008. All trailers and vehicles must be off the PIBYC premises no later than 3:00 pm, July 18, 2008. Participants will be informed as to when they may bring trailers and vehicles back onto club grounds at the end of the regatta. All trailers will be stored in a designated area off-site.

Alcohol & Drugs: Consumption of alcohol by competitors or use/ingestion of any drugs not prescribed by a physician is STRICTLY PROHIBITED. If a competitor must take medication prescribed by a physician, the parent or chaperone must inform the regatta committee **in writing** at the time of registration. In accordance with US Sailing Regulation 5.03, competitors violating this rule will be dismissed from the regatta and sent home. Additionally, the competitor's Club will be denied participation in the subsequent year's I-LYA Junior Bay Week Regatta.

Guest Responsibility: Competitors will be housed for five nights at the Grand Islander Inn and must furnish their own towels. All housing will be chaperoned. Competitors being housed on the island enjoy a privilege, not a “right.” They are personally responsible for maintaining the condition of their assigned room and its furnishings until being checked out on Friday morning. **Food, drinks, or smoking are NOT permitted in the rooms at any time.** Horseplay, hazing, or abuse of any kind will not be tolerated. Violations can lead to dismissal from the regatta and financial responsibility for damages.

Listed below are specific items of responsibility for each competitor:

- 1 Please do not dry towels or wet clothing on the furniture.
- 2 Towels are NOT supplied by the hotel. You must furnish your own.
- 3 Deal with trash appropriately on and off the water.
- 4 Bus your own tables at all meals and respect the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club and the hotel by keeping the grounds clean, leaving them better than when you arrived.
- 5 At all times, act like young ladies & gentlemen. You represent not only yourself, but also your Club, the I-LYA and our sport.

Competitors should always maintain the highest level of personal conduct.

Meals paid for in the Registration Fee include: four (4) breakfasts, four (4) lunches, and four (4) dinners. This includes Sunday’s Ice-Breaker and Thursday’s Awards Banquet. There will be no dinner served on Wednesday night. Wednesday is “Team Night Out” and is the responsibility of each Club. All meals will be served at the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club with the exception of The Ice-Breaker and Awards Banquet, which will be at the Niagara Center.

Competitor’s Agreement: I accept I-LYA’s invitation to sail in the 2008 Junior Bay Week Regatta. By accepting this invitation, I agree to comply with the restrictions on drinking and the use of illegal drugs, with the 10:00 pm nightly curfew, and with all other rules outlined above. I also agree to share in the responsibility for making the event run smoothly both on and off the water, and I will participate fully in the special events and programs provided for me. In particular, I will respect that fact that others, too, are taking this event seriously; I will respect property that is not mine; I will respect the efforts of the event hosts and committee; and, I will show appreciation to the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club and Grand Islander Inn, our hosts. I will maintain the highest standards of personal conduct throughout the event and expect the same from my fellow competitors.
