



Rules of Conduct

Sailors, after reading this information carefully and thoughtfully with your parents or guardian, please sign and submit the Rules of Conduct Acknowledgement Form (page 2).

You may keep this sheet for your reference.

CURFEW (10:30 pm Sunday-Wednesday; 11:00 pm Thursday): Each team member and his/her chaperone(s) are responsible for seeing that competitors enter and remain in their sleeping rooms by the stated curfew times with lights out at 11:00 pm (Sunday-Wednesday) and at 11:30 pm on Thursday. Same sex visitation between rooms is allowed until 10:30 pm. Co-ed visitation (including coaches) is NOT permitted at any time. When chaperones are certain that all their competitors are accounted for, they shall enter the date, time, club name, and chaperone signature on the sign-in sheet at the hotel desk. In the event of bad weather, cancelled races, and at all other times that the competitors are not restricted to the grounds of the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club or sleeping in their rooms, supervision of each club's competitors is the sole responsibility of that club's chaperones. The hotel requires that all competitors are supervised when at the hotel.

"NO WHEELS" RULE: The Grand Islander Hotel is within walking distance of all events. For the safety of the competitors, competitors may not ride in or on any vehicle of any kind during the regatta. This "NO WHEELS" rule includes (but is not limited to) automobiles, trucks, SUVs, golf carts, skateboards, bicycles, scooters, and rollerblades. Quite simply, IF IT HAS WHEELS, DON'T RIDE IN OR ON IT. This rule is in effect for the entire duration of the regatta from registration on Sunday through 6:00 am on Friday, July 23.

ALCOHOL & DRUGS: No competitor shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, distilled spirits, etc.) or any controlled substance (marijuana, cocaine, etc.) the possession of which is unlawful. Infringements of this regulation will be the basis for disciplinary action. This regulation is in effect during the entire event, from the date and time of arrival through the date and time of departure from the event location. For violations of this regulation, a hearing will be held with the regatta chairpersons and Jury, and penalties imposed may range from reprimand to dismissal from the regatta. Additionally, the hearing officers may recommend further action under US Sailing RRS 69.

MEALS: Competitors are expected to attend all scheduled meals and to bus their own tables at all times. There will be no dinner served on Wednesday night. Wednesday is "Team Night Out" and the responsibility of each club. All meals will be served at the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club with the exception of the Ice-Breaker dinner and Awards Banquet, which will be at the Niagara Conference Center. Lunches will be served on the water. Each competitor is responsible for making their own lunch in the morning before launching, and placing their lunch in the proper receptacle for distribution on the water.

PARKING is limited at the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club. Please follow the parking restrictions and directions included in the General Information handout.

GUEST RESPONSIBILITY: Competitors will be housed for five nights at the Grand Islander Hotel. Competitors are reminded that it is a *privilege*, and not a "right" to be provided housing for this regatta, and that all sailors are personally responsible for the maintenance and condition of their assigned room and its furnishings until checked out by a committee member on Friday morning. Horseplay, hazing, or abuse of any kind will not be tolerated. Violations can lead to dismissal from the regatta and financial responsibility for damages. Rooms must be cleared of all people and belongings by 8:30am Friday.

Listed below are specific items of responsibility for each competitor:

1. Towels are NOT supplied by the hotel. You must furnish your own.
2. Wet towels and wet clothing should be hung in the bathroom, and not on the furniture.
3. No smoking, no candles, no incense-- no burning of anything allowed in rooms.
4. NO guests in the rooms after curfew. NO co-ed visitation at any time (including coaches.) Only competitors may sleep in the rooms.
5. Take care when eating and drinking in rooms. Dispose of trash appropriately on and off the water.
6. Competitors are welcome to use the pool at the Islander Inn next door. Pool rules and regulations are posted at the pool. Competitors are NOT permitted at *Splash* at the Grand Islander Hotel.
7. Respect the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club and the hotel by keeping the grounds clean.
8. At all times, act like young ladies & gentlemen. You represent yourself, your club, I-LYA, and our sport.

FRIDAY MORNING HOTEL CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES

1. Everyone and everything must be completely out of the rooms by 8:30 am. If needed, there is a storage area where gear can be stored and picked up later in the day.
2. Each sailor must check out with the regatta staff and each room must be checked by the regatta staff before sailors leave the hotel.
3. If there is unreported damage found by the hotel staff after sailors have left, all sailors in the room will split the cost of repair.
4. The last person in the room should prop the door open by placing the deadbolt across the door before it is shut.

By accepting this invitation, I agree to comply with the restrictions on drinking and the use of illegal drugs, with the 10:30 pm nightly curfew (11:00pm Thursday) and with all other rules outlined above. I also agree to share in the responsibility for making the event run smoothly both on and off the water, and I will participate fully in the special events and programs provided for me. In particular, I will respect the fact that others, too, are taking this event seriously; I will respect property that is not mine; I will respect the efforts of the event hosts and committee; and, I will show appreciation to the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club and Grand Islander Hotel, our hosts. I will maintain the highest standards of personal conduct throughout the event and expect the same from my fellow competitors
